Alloys in the Scrap Stream

Increased microalloying of steels introduces new challenges for the foundry. What are some of these alloying elements? How are they detected? How should we address alloys and micro alloys in the scrap stream? How can they impact iron quality? What are effective countermeasures? Gene and David will be with us to answer these questions and share their expertise about alloys in the scrap stream.
